Pet Insurance - What is it?

Pet insurance isn't as new as we would think. In fact, the first pet insurance plan was written in 1890 in Sweden and in 1947 the first insurance policy was sold in Britain. However, it wouldn't be until 1982 when the first insurance policy was sold in the United States. To date, it is estimated that only a mere 4% of dogs and 1% of cats in the United States are covered by a pet insurance plan. With advancements in veterinary medicine and the increasing cost of medical care, it is vital to bridge the gap between Gold Standard level of care and the costs incurred for such care. Like human medical insurance, there are many different kinds of insurance plans that exist for our pets. They can include coverage for wellness preventative care, illness/injury, or a mix of both. Some plans include deductibles while others do not or have the option to select your deductible. We encourage you to research and compare plans to find the one that works best for you and your family. We will cover more in-depth one insurance company which we prefer, called Trupanion Pet Insurance, and the reasons we prefer them.

Trupanion Pet Insurance - Why it is Our Favorite

While there are many different insurance companies that cover pets, Trupanion is the one we recommend the most. Trupanion allows us to provide Gold Standard customer service and care to our clients. In 1998, Darryl started Trupanion (originally called Vetinsurance International, Inc.) with the goal of introducing a high-quality medical insurance offering for cats and dogs. Being a Trupanion Express hospital means that we never have to fill out claim forms and it links directly to our patient accounts so we can submit pre-approvals so you know exactly what will be covered before the cost is accrued. We can also get Trupanion to cover your bill directly, meaning you only have to pay the clinic in the event there is a difference in what is covered and what must be paid out of pocket. Trupanion also never limits the amount they pay out, so your pet can always get the best care. From nose to tail, your pet is covered for: Hereditary conditions your breed is prone to inheriting, unidentified issues,



even if your pet doesn't have an official diagnosis, and congenital conditions your pet developed before birth. Trupanion truly provides coverage the way pet owners expect with multiple options for coverage.

Grooming - More than just looks

Many pet owners have the misconception that grooming is not necessary. However, it is a crucial part of a pet's overall health and well-being. Quality pet grooming is about more than keeping your pet looking cute and smelling good. With proper pet grooming, you can decrease shedding, eliminate fleas and ticks, and even detect health conditions. Many pet groomer develop longterm relationships with their clients and remember the pets they see on a regular basis. This means they can be helpful in locating and identifying potential problems such as ear infections, irritation to the skin, or new lumps that were not present at the previous groom. In addition, a properly maintained coat is less likely to trap dirt, harbor pathogens, or get matted which can affect the blood supply to the underlying skin.

Hurricane Preparedness

The best way to protect your family from the effects of a disaster is to have a disaster plan. If you are a pet owner or have larger animals (i.e. livestock) it is important that you also consider their needs when developing your disaster plan. If you evacuate your home, DO NOT LEAVE YOUR PETS OR ANIMALS BEHIND. It is unlikely for pets or larger animals to survive on their own. If by some chance they do, you may not be able to find them when you return. Prepare now and protect your family and pets before the next disaster strikes.

Have a safe place to take your pets. Service animals who assist people with disabilities are allowed in Red Cross shelters. It may be difficult, to find shelter for your animals in the midst of a disaster, so plan ahead. Do not wait until disaster strikes to do your research. Many communities are developing pet friendly shelter plans, check to see if your local emergency shelter plan includes pets.



Hurricane Preparedness cont.

Whether you are away from home for a day or a week, you will need essential supplies to care for your pet. Keep items in an accessible place and store them in sturdy containers that can be carried easily (duffle bags, covered trash containers, etc.). Your pet disaster supply kit should include: Medications and medical records (stored in a waterproof container) and a first aid kit, sturdy leashes, harnesses, and/or carriers to transport pets safely and ensure that your animals cannot escape, photo of you and your pet(s) — in the event you are separated from your pet, having an updated photo with your pet will help validate pet ownership, food, potable water, bowls, cat litter/pan, and can opener, information on feeding schedules, medical conditions, behavior problems, and the name and number of your veterinarian in case you have to foster or board your pets, and lastly pet beds and toys, if easily transportable.

You may not be home when the evacuation order comes. Find out if a trusted neighbor would be willing to take your pets and meet you at a prearranged location. This person should be comfortable with your pets, know where your animals are likely to be, know where your pet disaster supplies kit is kept, and have a key to your home.

Planning and preparation will enable you to evacuate with your pets quickly and safely. However, bear in mind that animals react differently under stress. Outside your home and in the car, keep dogs securely leashed. Transport cats in carriers.
